Speaker: Kevin Pawlak

Author, Antietam National Battlefield Guide

Topic: The Battle of Shepherdstown

Kevin was born and raised in western New York and became interested in the Civil War following a trip to Gettysburg at the age of 9. He recently graduated from Shepherd University with a Major in Civil War and 19th Century America and a minor in Historic Preservation. Kevin has worked at Harpers Ferry National Historical Park and serve as a Licensed Battlefield Guide at Antietam. He completed internships with the Papers of Abraham Lincoln at the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library as well as at the Missouri Civil War Museum. Currently, Kevin is in the process of writing his first book, Shepherdstown in the Civil War: One Vast Confederate Hospital, to be released in September 2015 and published by The History Press.

Kevin's topic discusses the important strategic and political implications of the small and lesser known Battle of Shepherdstown, which ended the Maryland Campaign and secured a much needed victory for the United States, a victory that Abraham Lincoln followed with the announcement of the Preliminary Emancipation Proclamation.
