
Presentation Overview: Lee's Army in Maryland: A New Perspective on the September 1862 Campaign

Most students of the Civil War believe the story of Robert E. Lee's 1862 Maryland Campaign is complete, and that new studies must rely on interpretations long-since accepted and understood. But what if this is not the case? What if the histories previously written

about the first major Confederate operation north of the Potomac River missed key sources, proceeded from mistaken readings of the evidence, or were influenced by Lost Cause ideology? Dr. Rossino demonstrates that these types of distortions continue to shape modern understanding of the campaign and offers suggestions for how to correct them, developing in the process a new understanding of what General Lee hoped to accomplish in September 1862.

Presenters Bio: Alex Rossino earned his masters and doctoral degrees in history at Syracuse University. A writer and historian living in western Maryland, Dr. Rossino is the author of several historical novels and non-fiction histories. His book *Six Days in September: A Novel of Lee's Army in Maryland, September 1862* (Savas Beatie 2017) received excellent reviews from historians and

Civil War enthusiasts, leading him to write a sequel titled *The Guns of September: A Novel of McClellan's Army in Maryland, September 1862*, that is due out in 2023. Savas Beatie also published Dr. Rossino's book, *Their Maryland: The Army of Northern Virginia from the Potomac Crossing to Sharpsburg in September 1862* in November 2021, and he currently has a co-authored book with Gene M. Thorp called *The Tale Untwisted: General George B. McClellan, The Maryland Campaign, and the Discovery of Lee's Lost Orders*, scheduled for release in early 2023. Both books challenge long-held beliefs about the 1862 Maryland Campaign while offering new insight into one of the Civil War's most important periods.



In Case you missed it



Our December offering was a fascinating presentation by historian Tom McMillan, exploring the true historical facts behind the much talked about personal relationship between General's Armistead and Hancock A lifelong student of the Civil war Tom McMillan presented his part dual biography and part Civil War history, Armistead and Hancock: Behind the Gettysburg Legend takes a fascinating deep dive into the friendship between Confederate General Lewis Armistead and Union General Winfield Scott Hancock -- a friendship that has been heavily dramatized in popular novels and movies such as the famous 1993 film "Gettysburg"

Based on his years of research and previously untapped sources, the book provides new information and fresh perspective to reverse decades of misconceptions about an amazing story of two friends that has come to define the Civil War. It was clear from his presentation that a relationship did exist, both families with ties together in California. If not personal correspondence, sufficient circumstantial and anecdotal fact trails of a close relationship do exist.

Although comrades and close friends, perhaps not as robust a "lifelong" friendship portrayed in legend and film.







Summer Conference

JUNE 9-14, 2023

For nearly 40 years, the Civil War Institute at Gettysburg College has hosted a premiere annual summer conference bringing leading historians and public audiences together. Sessions, lodging, and meals are held on the 200-acre college campus.

The 2023 CWI Conference will feature a wide range of topics, including Lincoln as Commander in Chief, the Civil War in Appalachia, Harriet Tubman, John Singleton Mosby, Confederate widowhood, retaliation in the American Civil War, the Army of Tennessee, and more.

In addition to touring the Gettysburg battlefield, participants will have the opportunity to visit a variety of other nearby battlefields and historic sites on tours that will explore Antietam and Harpers Ferry, or to combine a half-day of focused class work with a half-day out on the battlefield, exploring, in-depth, the actions on the 1st or 3rd day of battle at Gettysburg. Participants who may prefer a shorter, more physically active conference experience can also choose to sign up for our new "active track" package, featuring a combination of Friday and Saturday morning lectures and a day and a half of walking-intensive tours of the Gettysburg battlefield on Saturday and Sunday, exploring the First Day's battlefield and the Union Fishhook, off the beaten path!

This conference will also continue the popular "lunch-in" and "dinein" small group discussions with CWI faculty.

The 2023 conference will offer something for everyone, from longtime students of the Civil War to those who are new to Civil War history.
