Presentation Overview: Civil War Florida

Civil War Florida. In many respects, Florida remains the forgotten state of the Confederacy. Although the third state to secede, Florida's small population (ranking last among the Confederate states with some 140,000 people), meager industrial resources, and mostly isolated from the other states of the Confederacy made Florida of little strategic importance to either side. Yet it was strategic in controlling the shipping lanes of the Caribbean. This program focuses on Key

West, Fort Zachery Taylor, Battle of Olustee, the Dry Tortugas, Fort Jefferson, and more.

Presenters BIO: Lynn Herman is the former State Representative in the PA House of Representatives serving the 77th Legislative District largely Philipsburg, Port Matilda, and State College areas of Centre County for 24 years (1983 – 2006). He is currently a Government Relations/Business Development Consultant and President of Hometown Sports Magazine.

Julianne Herman is retired after 45 years employed as a Registered Nurse in the Operating Room, graduating from St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing. She currently serves as Secretary on the PA Military Museum Board of Directors. Both Mr. and Mrs. Herman are Civil War reenactors and share an interest and passion for all American history. They have served the Central PA Civil War Round Table for several years as President and Secretary respectively. Lynn and Julianne have presented



programs to Civil War Round Tables on their Civil War travels. These include Civil War in the Far, Far West, Civil War Florida, Tragedy in Lawrenceville, PA – The Allegheny Arsenal Explosion, and The New Mexico Campaign and the Battle of Glorieta Pass, the Gettysburg of the West.

In case you Missed it:



For the November offering of the Civil War Roundtable, Mr. G. Bert Stephanson presented to approximately 30 FCCWRT members and guests at the National Museum of Civil War Medicine (NMCWM). He told us the fascinating history of the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) and the Civil War Pension system, the GAR, first established for Veterans of the Union Army, and then later for both sides of this historic conflict. A once great organization, steering the course of American politics and caring for those who fought and those they left behind, forming a sons and an

Auxiliary unit. Bert discussed the simultaneous rise and fall of the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) and the Civil War Pension System. Near the turn of the century and beyond tremendous in its reach and scope with posts across America and thousands in their ranks of membership. The



GAR was a fraternal organization, and the pension was a federal program. They both rose to power and influence just after the war ended. Both declined slowly as the veterans, their wives and children passed away. Eventually, as time passed and the conflict was in distant memory the organization faded and much like the conflict that prompted its organization became a part of our history.

November Book Review

Such a Clash of Arms: The Maryland Campaign, September 1862, Kevin Pawlak: Casemate, 2023. 128 pp. + notes, maps and images, \$24.95 (paperback), ISBN 978-1636242668. Reviewed by: Matthew A. Borders

This summer has seen some truly remarkable and impressive scholarship on the Maryland Campaign. While many of us are slogging away on the tome, I Dread the Thought of the Place, another, much more concise work, Such a Clash of Arms, was also released by the up-and-coming publishing house, Casemate Publishing. This brief campaign study was written by friend of the round table, Kevin Pawlak. Kevin is one of the great rising stars of Civil War scholarship and has done a great job developing a study of the campaign that it is easy to throw into a day pack and take with you up South Mountain, over the fields of Antietam or even across the Potomac River to Shepherdstown.

Besides the tight writing and excellent bio's of the various personalities involved in the campaign, Such a Clash of Arms, offers great quotes and insights. These include quotes and writings not only from the officers of the contending armies, but also the common fighting man in the ranks. Adding to the idea of using this book in the field are the excellent maps provided by famed cartographer, Hal Jespersen. These are bright, easy to read and give an excellent idea of the wide variety of movements utilized in the Maryland Campaign at each of its battles.

Additionally, Such a Clash of Arms, is chock full of excellent photographs. Many of these are the classic Alexander Gardner and James Gibson images that shocked the psyche of the nation in late 1862, now printed in a beautiful glossy format. Additionally though the author has dug through the Library of Congress for many images of the officer corps and the moving sketches of Alfred Waude, all presented in high resolution. Finally, there are the images taken by the author himself, a wide variety of landscape shots, showing the fields as they are today, as well as images of a number of the monuments that are scattered through the fields and mountains of western Maryland.

If you are looking for a quick synopsis of the Maryland Campaign that takes in the latest research, providing fresh perspectives on not only the cause, battles and conclusion of the first Confederate Invasion above the Potomac River, look no further that Such a Clash of Arms. Definitely one to look into, especially for those looking for a modern interpretation of the campaign without having to hack through 900 pages.
